



Brother Turgeon built an ocean current turbine. His team researched an optimum turbine design and produced a working prototype. They 3-D printed the turbines and reinforced them with fiberglass. The team also hand-built The generator located in the center of the two turbines. Their outcome is great engineering work. To reduce the cost of infrastructure to house the turbines, the team suggests attaching them to existing ocean buoys. Brother Turgeon says they start in-water trials soon.

Brothers Traveling the World


In completion of his Interactive Qualifying Project, Brother Omri
